

## DRAWING WITH SHAPES

### **Episode 210:** Blossom and Snappy Go to the Zoo, Part Two **Kindergarten**

#### **Georgia Performance Standards**

- MKG1a Recognize and name the following basic two-dimensional shapes: triangles, rectangles, squares, and circles
- MKG1d Combine basic shapes into basic and more complicated shapes, and will decompose basic shapes into combinations of basic shapes
- ELAKLSV1e Describes people, places, things, locations, and actions

#### **Objectives**

- The students will use a circle, triangle, rectangle, square, and arc to draw a picture.
- The students will tell the class orally what it is that they drew.

#### **Materials**

- TV/VCR or Computer/LCD Projector
- Video *Count On It!* 210
- Paper, pencils, crayons

#### **Procedure**

##### *Opening*

- View *Count On It!* 210 clip “Shapes” (VHS 17:22 – 18:12).
- Ask the question, “What can you draw with a circle, triangle, rectangle, and arc?”

##### *Work time*

- Students work individually to create a picture using those five shapes.
- You monitor and assist where necessary. Encourage students to be creative.

##### *Closing*

- Have each student stand up with his/her drawing and tell the class what it is.

#### **Assessment**

- Picture can be graded. (Did the student use all five shapes? Did the student draw each shape correctly? Was the student able to describe what he/she drew to the class?)
